Introduction

Hello, I am Leah Miller (Ms. Leah) and I am so excited for this school year. This handbook was created to help everyone understand the classroom and school expectations. Medications

The office will only provide Tums and water to students unless a Medication Form has been filled out. All medications, prescription or over-the-counter, **MUST** be turned into the office. Students are **NOT** allowed to carry any type of medication with them except if required by a physician and the Office has been notified and Medication Form completed. All medications will be stored in a locked cabinet.

Prescription Medicine: If the student requires any prescription medication, the medication must come to the Office in the prescription container as put up by the pharmacist. Written directions from the physician or pharmacist must state the name of the patient, the name of the medicine, the dosage, and the time it is to be given. The medication must be turned into the office by the parent or quardian and a Medication Form completed.

Over-the-Counter Medications: The Office does provide Tylenol or Ibuprofen to students that have it marked on their Medication Form. Any other over-the-counter medicine sent by the parent/guardian to be administered to a student must come to the Office in the original manufacturer's packaging with all directions, dosages, compound contents, side effects, and proportions clearly marked and a Medication form completed by parent or quardian.

I will be using the app "Remind" for most of my day-to-day communication with parents. I will send you a link to join during the first 2 weeks of school and will explain how to set the app up and accept my invitation. Remind is a free text messaging app that helps teachers, students, and parents communicate quickly and efficiently. Messages are sent in real time to an entire class, a small group, or just a single person. With Remind, you can send text messages straight to any phone, including flip phones. Remind's guidelines, practices, and features have been designed to protect the safety and security of users and their personal information. Remind has been certified by iKeepSafe for privacy practices related to COPPA, FERPA, and California Student Privacy

Grading Policy:

<u>Homework</u>

If you would like consistent homework that will help your student, please read with them or have them read independently for 20 minutes each day. Reading fluency is incredibly important for all students.

Spelling assessments will be given every other Wednesday. I will send a spelling list home if you would like to practice with your student. We will be practicing and reviewing in the classroom.

Homework can be beneficial in specific circumstances where students need additional one on one support to increase their reading or math fluency skills. If you think your student might be in need of this additional support, please reach out to me and we can discuss what might be helpful.

Take Home Folders:

Students will be bringing a folder back and forth daily. This will be one way for me to communicate with you. One side will be labeled "keep at home", these are things that you can remove and keep at home. The other side will be labeled "Return to school", where information that may need to be signed and returned will be. Please check these folders every day.

Retake/Reteach

If a student scores below 70% on an assessment, he or she may retake the assessment to earn up to 70%

Electronic Devices

If your child brings their electronic devices to school, WCC will not be liable for them. All devices MUST be turned in and given to the teacher to store for the day, this is not optional.

If they are caught with an electronic device in their possession, it will be taken from them, and a parent/guardian will have to pick it up in the office. The student will no longer be able to bring that device to school for the remainder of the year.

If you need to reach your child during the day, please call the office and they will relay the message to your child.

Helpful Reminders for School

- School begins at 8:15am and ends at 3:00pm. Please have your students at school on time and remember to pick them up after school on time.
- There is no school on Fridays.
- The earliest you may drop off your child is 7:45am. There are no adults available to supervise until 7:45am.
- Please make sure your child has their take-home folder, a spill proof water bottle, snack, lunch, and a jacket (when needed) in their backpack every day.
- Lunches must be cold lunches. We do not have the ability to heat up your child's food for snack or lunch.
- All students should have a classroom sweatshirt or sweater they keep at school for use when they get chilly in the classroom.
- Please Label anything and everything your child brings to school (backpacks, lunch boxes, jackets, etc.)
- For safety reasons we ask that your child wear close-toed shoes to school.
- Toys are not permitted at school (unless otherwise discussed for behavior purposes or special days).
- A few times during the year, I might play G and PG movies in class without a permission slip. Please let me know if you have any questions or concerns about what will be shown.

Show and Share

***During the 1st week of school, each student may bring ONE stuffed animal to school each day. $\stackrel{\smile}{\cup}$

After the 1st week of school, we will rotate the students bringing in something to share with the class. I will send home a calendar each month so you will know what day your student has "show and share". We will do it in a "guessing" format, so the object should be small enough to fit into a medium sized bag. Your child will have the opportunity to give us 3 clues so we can try and guess what they brought to share. \bigcirc
